Principal Parry reported on the K-2 phonics focus, Spanish class interest and prom.

Superintendent Sampson gave legislative updates affecting education, coaching vacancy for JH track, Title IX training, shared current enrollment and enrollment projections, discussed the 2020-2021 school calendar with regards to snow make-up days, US Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights Determination, and the Safe School Procedure updates.
